DR. SMITH

The CDC grant for Project GRIP has come to a close, but SOAR remains front and center for Dr. Smith. The SOAR team welcomed a new Project Director, Anne Perez, a new Research Specialist, Raquell Marshall, and deployed the intervention with the second of our four school partners.

Dr. Smith has also been appointed to the American Foundation for Suicide Prevention's (AFSP) Scientific Advisory Council. His mentee, Dr. Heather Love of the Department of Human Development and Family Studies at the University of Alabama, was awarded the AFSP Mentored Early Career Research Grant for a study on romantic relationship dynamics and suicidal ideation.

Kaitlyn Schuler started her first year as an Assistant Professor in the Department of Psychology at the University of North Carolina–Wilmington.

Karin Hendricks successfully proposed her dissertation. She also continues serving as a group facilitator for Prism Families, conducting ongoing CAMS training for UCWC staff and interns, and offering the DBT group at UCWC.

Though Emma Kate Hancock has officially moved out of the CCP and into the BBS, she is working on her BBS First Year Project examining employment and suicidal ideation among psychiatric inpatients.

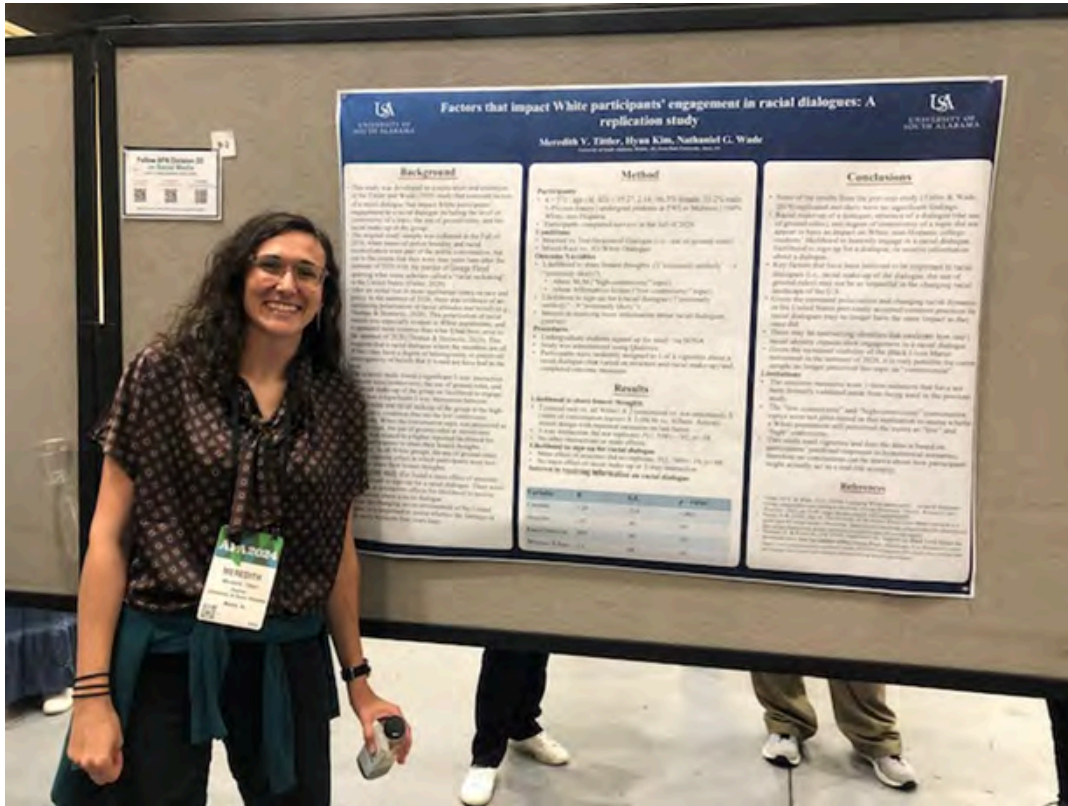
Meredith and Rian are working with colleagues at Children's & Women's Hospital to develop a cultural competency lunch and learn series for medical staff this spring.

LAB UPDATES:

Elizabeth, Victoria, and Hyun: We all have successfully proposed our dissertation!!!

Victoria and Hyun continue to provide assessment services through the court.

Victoria was selected as a recipient for the HRSA Team-Based Trauma-Informed Integrated Behavioral Health Workforce Education and Training Professions for the Gulf Coast Region grant.

All three doc students are working on a long-term study of the impact of the Helping Families Initiative (HFI). HFI is a program, now run in multiple Alabama DA offices, that began in Mobile. It targets youth and families presenting in truancy court and diverts them from prosecution to case management and various targeted interventions. The students and Dr. Stefurak are examining the adult outcomes of youth who took part in the program from 2003 -2013.

Victoria is beginning work with Dr. Stefurak as program evaluators for the Connect & Protect Department of Justice Grant with the City of Mobile. This grant trains mental health professionals and police officer in co-response models that seek to divert mentally ill citizens from incarceration and to psychiatric stabilization care.

Hyun and Victoria have served as coders for a study Dr. Stefurak and Dr. Bowman (nursing) are conducting at the Child Advocacy Center of Mobile. This study examines procedures in the CAC's Crisis Response Team meetings in which child sexual abuse cases are presented and determinations about indictment and prosecution are made.

Bailey passed her Discipline Specific Knowledge Comprehensive Evaluation.

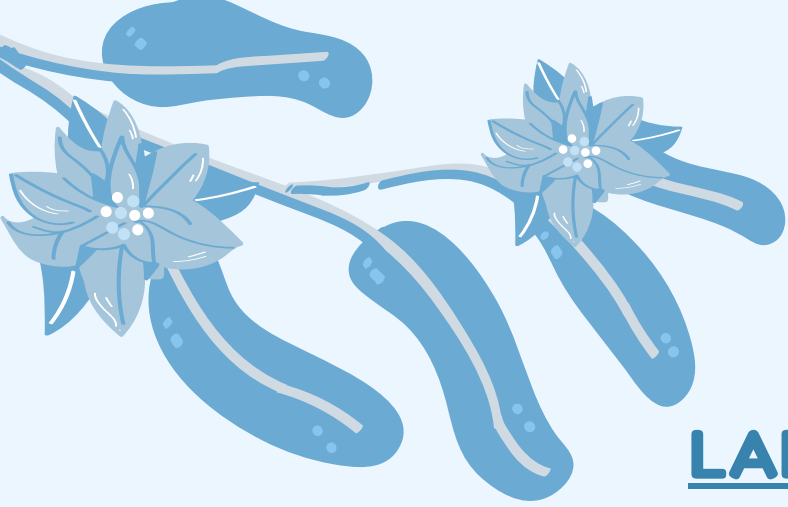
Bailey served as a member on the National Academy of Neuropsychology Clinical research Grant Committee.

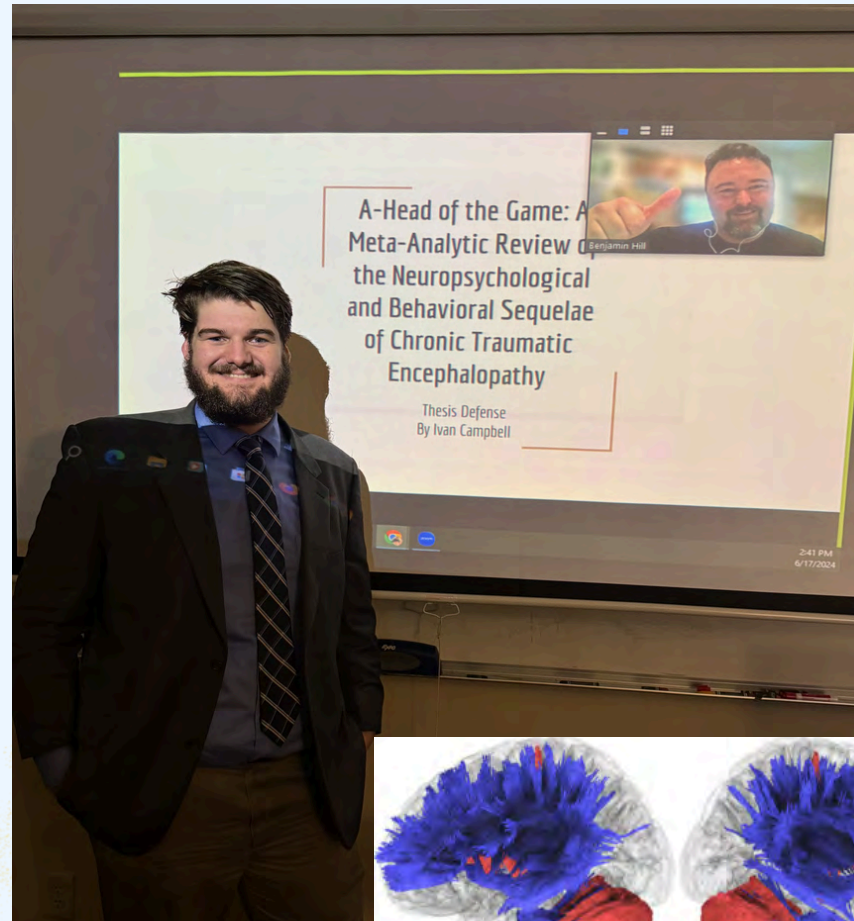

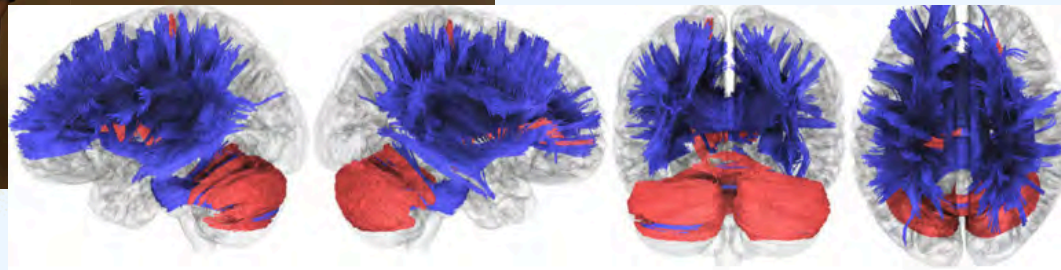
Ivan completed the South Alabama Area Health Education Center Program.

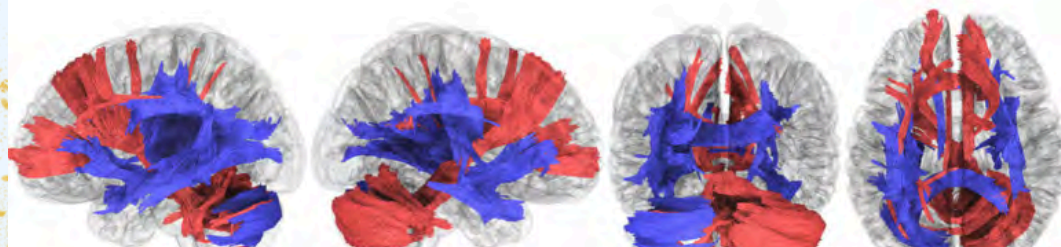
Katherine began performing cognitive evaluations for the Alabama Department of Vocational Rehabilitative Services through the clinic.
